Positions open until filled, but to ensure full consideration, applications must be postmarked by **15 March 2002**.

- 1) A required participation fee of \$800, including a non-refundable deposit of \$100 due upon acceptance and balance due by 3 May, 2003.
- 2) Course registration required: Clas 5120 or ArtH 5120 for Univ. of Minnesota Summer Session I or II. Non-Minnesota residents may register through College of Continuing Education (CCE) for reduced tuition.
- 3) All participants must be in good health and must carry health/accident insurance valid in Greece.
- 4) Applicants should be aware that archaeological field work involves long days of physical labor, often under difficult conditions; water for wash and shower is scarce.
- 5) Meals and housing will be provided, though accommodation will be crowded and basic, frequently in a dormitory setting.
- 6) Participants are responsible for their own transportation to and from Greece, to and from Athens, and for accommodations in transit to the site.
